Please always include as much detail as possible (samples, website links, etc.) to facilitate a timely approval.

Once complete, please submit the Architectural Review form to TMG (contact information is furnished at the end of this newsletter).

Signs

Directional Signs



Directional signs are not allowed to be installed or used for **commercial advertising purposes** within the Arbor Ridge neighborhood. This includes any posters, bulletins, painting or other advertising placed, posted, tacked, nailed, or otherwise fastened or affixed (including signs placed directly on or in the ground). Please refer to the Signs Resolution on the website for more information.

Rent Signs



When a "For Rent" sign needs to be posted, it can only be displayed in the window of the home.

Refuse Containers



Have you ever received a letter for leaving your garbage can or recycling bin out in the street – and it wasn't your receptacle? We would like to suggest that you use a black marker or colored tape and place your house number on your own garbage cans and recycling bins. This will be most helpful in making sure that you do not receive any reminders that aren't truly yours.

Garbage cans must be removed from the street after next pick up day and stored out of community view.

Mailbox Advertising

The Homeowners Association spent over \$3,000.00 a few years ago to clean the mailbox stands. Please do not tape items to the mailbox areas. Please make a note that all parts of the mailboxes, including the post, are the domain of the U.S. Postal Service.

Basketball Hoops



Please store all Basketball Hoops out of community view when not in use. All Basketball Hoops must be in good condition including net, backboard and base.

Natural Habitat Update



In keeping our Natural Habitat beautiful, the Arbor Ridge HOA is monitoring and managing an ongoing review and maintenance program. Several resources are assisting in keeping and managing the compliancy of our Natural Habitat. This is inclusive of water level control, debris removal and vegetation enhancements.
