Annual Meeting is October 23rd

Please join the ARHOA Board at the Bethany Elementary School, 3305 Northwest 174th Avenue, Portland, OR 97229 on **Tuesday, October 23rd at 6:30 PM** for our Annual Meeting.

This is a mandatory meeting that must be held each year by the home owners association according to Oregon ORS 94.650. It is required that we have a quorum to do the necessary business of the home owner association. A quorum is the minimum number of members of a deliberative assembly (a body that uses parliamentary, such as legislature) necessary to conduct the business of that group.

We need 143 in person or by proxy to meet quorum requirements.

*****There will be a raffle drawing with prizes for the individuals who attend "in person" at the meeting. (One raffle ticket per household, with a proxy turned in, in person)

The community can reach quorum in two ways. You can **attend the annual meeting** or send in a proxy which must be filled in properly and received by the Board at or before the Annual Meeting.

The ARHOA has three (3) positions available on the Board. We would like to elect people for these positions at the Annual Meeting. If you have an interest in serving on the Board please attend the annual meeting on October 23rd, 2012.

Here are some tips that we have just for you kids, to help keep you safe on Halloween night! Some of these ideas are called "common sense" ideas that means that they are things that you should know and use every day in life. You are never too young to learn!

⚠Never, ever go into a stranger's house or even ring their door for treats unless your parents are with you and say that it's okay.
